THE VISITATION OF THE ARCHBISHOP OF BIRMINGHAM

Archbishop Bernard Longley will be visiting the Parish on Sat 27 & Sun 28 Jan. He would like to meet as many parishioners as possible. To do that, he will be present at all the Sunday Masses. In addition, there will be three extra events:

Sat 27 Jan - 5.30pm: Meeting at St Joseph's

Over the past few months there has been the Synod in Rome. But closer to home, there has been both Deanery meetings and a Parish meeting about the Diocesan Vision. This will be an opportunity for the Archbishop to reflect with us as we seek to proclaim the Gospel in the challenges the Church faces in our own day. The Diocesan Vision is focused on four themes: 1) Evangelisation

- 2) Formation (the deepening of faith of Catholics)
- 3) Liturgy and Worship
- 4) Social Outreach

Sun 28 Jan - 12.30pm: 'Bring and Share' Lunch.

This will be a more informal gathering when all parishioners – old, young and everything in-between - are welcome to gather together, share a table, and meet the Archbishop.

The Archbishop will be visiting the Youth Group, which meets at St Joseph's each month.

Jonah 3:1-5,10

Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.'
