There will be the opportunity today to take away some blessed chalk this weekend together with prayers to use in the home also. I shall be talking about this in the homily. Please remember also to pray the Our Father in the home this week. Have you ever wondered why as Catholics we do not end the Our Father with "For yours are the kingdom and the power and the glory for ever"? Possibly from the second century liturgical usage concluded the Lord's Prayer with a doxology. In the Didache (2nd century) we find, "For yours are the power and the glory for ever". The Apostolic Constitutions (4th century) add "The kingdom" and this is the formula used in the Anglican tradition. The Catholic Tradition uses the words of Our Blessed Lord found in the Gospel of St Matthew and the Roman Missal then develops the doxology in the explicit perspective of awaiting our blessed hope and the Second Coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.
