Message from Fr Damian: The readings for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B invite us to hear God's calling and to respond. In the first reading, God calls to Samuel and he replies. The psalm speaks of waiting for the Lord and answering. In our Gospel reading this week, Jesus Calls his first two disciples. They follow Jesus, but he challenges them with the question 'What do you want?' They counter this question with another, 'Where do you live?' Jesus invites them: 'Come and see!'

The time they spend with Jesus makes a deep impression on them. Andrew cannot contain his enthusiasm. He is convinced that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah. He calls his brother Simon Peter. When Jesus meets Simon Peter, he does not hesitate to enlist him among the disciples and immediately gives him the new name, Cephas, which means Rock.

These verses are marked by the enthusiastic response of the first disciples to Jesus and their eagerness to spread the news about him. This eagerness is an echo of the first reading, in which Samuel is called as a boy to be a prophet. When the good news of salvation comes, when the encounter with the word of God arrives, it cannot be contained or suppressed. It is imperative to let others know!

Stratford Foodbank: The food bank has just calculated its end-of-year stats for 2023. They have given out 36% more parcels than in 2022 with 1894 of these going to feed children. This is a 47% increase in the parcel numbers allocated to children in 2022! January is one of the hardest months and many people struggle to get through. Last January, they gave out parcels which fed 415 adults and children. With your help, they can make life a little easier for many families in our community and make sure they have something to eat.
