**Message from Fr Damian:** Our first reading this week opens with a powerful narrative from the book of Jonah. Jonah, initially reluctant, finally obeys God's command to go to Nineveh. Jonah's experience also speaks to us about obedience and trust in God's plan. Often, we might feel reluctant or unqualified to undertake the tasks God sets before us. Jonah's journey reminds us that our willingness to listen and respond to God, even amidst fear and hesitation, can lead to incredible outcomes beyond our imagination.

Our Gospel this week begins with Jesus in Galilee proclaiming the 'good news' or 'gospel' of God. Jesus declares the coming of 'the time' and of 'the kingdom of God'. The essence of his preaching is that the time of fulfilment, the long-awaited time, has arrived. God's kingdom, God's rule, is coming. The reading continues with the call of the first disciples. They are taken away abruptly from their daily work of fishing. They respond immediately to Jesus' summons. They do not show the reluctance which Jonah showed. The call of Jesus is irresistible. They abandon both their work and their family ties. Something momentous is happening in their lives. It is amid the preoccupations of each day that the Lord calls his disciples, and calls them by name.

**Prayer Intentions:** We pray for all on our parish sick list and for those who care for them, May Christ be near them to bless them and keep them. We pray for those departed from this life, and for our parish anniversaries, Joe Fitzgerald, Jerry Fogarty, Robert Bullivant, Kath Shill, Bernard Green and Mavis Bailey. May Christ the light of the world draw all his people to new life and the fullness of redemption.
