T S Eliot's 'Journey of the Magi' i(1927) s worth reading today as we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, Especially, focussing, perhaps, on "the cities hostile and the towns unfriendly and the villages dirty and charging high prices…..", not unlike our world today, do you think?

Something compelled the Magi to search, to travel, to step positively outside their comfort zone, following a star. For a child in whom they believed had on offer meeting their deepest desires. Whatever were their reasons for following a star, they set out, found the child Jesus, and protected him by taking guidance in a dream not to report back to Herod. Theirs was a courage and an ingenuity to be envied.

From that moment on, we can surmise that the arrival of the Messiah was common knowledge, headlines, perhaps, in the press of the day. No longer the preserve of scholars of scripture. It did not take too long for Christianity to spread – Peter and Paul especially leading the charge into the popular culture of the day – and paying dearly for that.

I sometimes wonder whether, in the busyness of a modern technological culture, we have stepped back from telling people about the Messiah, acquiescing with the depleted numbers in church post covid. And whether we risk becoming a 'congregational church' with focus weekly entirely on those who attend church each week.

And then I stand corrected, as I look around the church and see 'new faces', folk introduced to church by you. As if you are saying, 'come and see' and, without any special language, echoing Philips' invitation to Nathaniel "we have found the one Moses wrote about, Jesus son of Joseph, from Nazareth" (John 1:43ff), you bring people to experience a sense of community, of belonging, that, unknown to themselves, they seek, and through you, they find.

Your initial invitation may not be well received – Nathaniel initially saw no good whatever coming out of Nazareth, just as many in 21C culture see the church as a waste of time and space, and even dangerous for some. Like the Magi, you have a 'star' that you follow, something that continues to inspire you to nourish your faith – and to share it, your way.

You may find "voices singing in (your) ears, saying that this (is) all folly" (ibid), yet you continue, one New Year after another, persevering and encouraging; We all need the courage and the ingenuity of the Magi to introduce Jesus to a culture that often feels it is, and can remain, self-sufficient.

Continue as you are to invite. You will, with the Magi, experience a joy, described as "a temperate valley...with a running stream....", a joy knowing that you are introducing God/Jesus to people – in new ways acceptable to a different culture. Do not grow weary!

Estates Weekend Caretaker – Princethorpe College - We are seeking a term-time Weekend Caretaker to join our friendly and professional Estates Department. The department work as a cohesive team to provide a multitude of operational duties across The Princethorpe Foundation. The Weekend Caretaker will oversee operations across the estates, primarily on Saturday's at Princethorpe College.

This wide-ranging role will oversee weekend tasks such as opening/closing the site, setting up for/packing down following events, facilitating sports fixtures and visitors, porterage, traffic management and helping to keep the site clean, tidy and well maintained.
