This week's Gospel – Matthew 2:1-12 'The visit of the Magi'

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward, and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Peace Sunday 2nd Collection

Next week their will be a collection for Pax Christi.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany of the Lord, when we recall the wise men who came a great distance to adore Christ, to give him their homage much more than gold, frankincense and myrrh. They had searched for the star, searched for the truth, and had found that the truth had a name, Jesus. Everything changed as a result. They had found that reassurance, that pearl of great price, and had given up what they had to give Jesus, the best they had. Like the wise men, we must search for the truth, we must follow the star wherever it leads us. This solemnity focuses in a special way on the reality of Jesus being the Light of the world that shines in the darkness, the reason light is closely associated with the feast of the Epiphany is the story of the Magi and how they followed a star to find Jesus. Pope Benedict XVI in his Epiphany homily of 2012: 'We may well look to these figures, the first Gentiles to find the pathway to Christ... No doubt there were many astronomers in ancient Babylon, but only these few set off to follow the star that they recognized as the star of the promise, pointing them along the path towards the true King and Saviour.' All of us have a calling to follow the Lord and we need to focus harder on hearing God's voice. The Magi were almost certainly not kings, and we are not sure if they were rich. But one thing is certain – they were wise. They recognised Christ is the Saviour of the World. Whereas his own people, the Jews, for the most part rejected him. What does Christ mean to me? To what extent is he the 'star' that I follow? He is the one who reveals God's love, the Good Shepherd, the Light of the World. He is, as it were, the explosion of God's love, which causes the great white light of his heart to shine upon the world. As we celebrate the Epiphany, may we follow the saints who lead us to the light of Christ and shows us the path to God.
