THE SEASON OF LENT - Last Wednesday the Pope, in his homily, spoke about the imposition of ashes — an act which reminds us to return to the truth about ourselves — which is that the Lord alone is God, and we are the work of his hands.

Therefore, Lent is a time when we are called to be ever more open to his grace - so that we may refashioned in the image of Christ. The tools for this refashioning are straightforward, though challenging: prayer; fasting and abstinence; works of mercy and almsgiving. Prayer is an act of love to the God who loved us first in his Son. Fasting reminds us of the One on whom we truly depend, and to strengthen us in the fight against the temptation to give ourselves to lesser gods or idols. Almsgiving, and works of mercy, seek to model our lives and our attitudes on the generosity of divine love which holds nothing back and gives everything.

There are a number of ways to strengthen our spiritual lives this Lent beyond that we can share:

The Lent Group on Wednesdays which will be exploring prayer

The Early Bird Mass on Fridays at 6.45am

Stations of the Cross on Fridays and Sundays

....as well as the usual Masses and devotions and groups.

Collect

Grant, almighty God, through the yearly observances of holy Lent, that we may grow in understanding of the riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First reading Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good

conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
