LENT 2024: SPRINGTIME FOR THE SOUL PENANCE + PRAYER + ALMS + FASTING

Hear us O Lord, have mercy upon us, for we have sinned against thee

WELCOME TO MASS: Welcome to Mass for the First Sunday in Lent. How is Lent going? Early days yet, of course, but we can begin to nurture good habits and cut out the bad, to let this 'Springtime for the soul' work in us. This season is the time to be honest about ourselves as sinners and also to be honest about God as the only source of mercy and life. Whatever is wrong with us, He can put it right. The readings today speak first of baptism. In Genesis the flood literally washes sin and sinners away but saves Noah and his family floating in the ark. Peter rejoices in our baptism which washes sin away and is a 'pledge to God'. It starts us on our Christian, pilgrim way as we strive to follow Jesus and answer His call to repent and believe. If our keeping of Lent makes us that bit more penitent and bit more faithful, then we will have indeed let this springtime help us grow closer to Him whom we follow. God bless, Fr Stephen
