## **Dear Parishioners**

"I am not asking you to do anything more than look at Him." (Saint Teresa of Avila).

Last weekend I was in a very happy place: The Carmel of the Magnificat, in Wolverhampton, home to an enclosed community of discalced Carmelite nuns. These nuns never leave their enclosure in the Carmel, except to seek medical help or vote, and they live lives of prayer, silence, austerity, manual labour and community life. It was my pleasure to spend the weekend in their guest quarters soaking up the deep tranquillity and holiness of that place.

The Carmelites talk of their vocation as "the wilderness", to go out and do battle in prayer with the forces of darkness in this world...and don't we need that at present! They lay down their own needs and wants to petition for others who are in trouble and pain.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is driven...a strong expression used by St Mark...out into the wilderness where He does battle with Satan, who is desperate to corrupt and ruin the Son of God, the only One who can liberate Creation from the powers of Darkness. St Mark's version is typically more terse and spare than St Matthew and St Luke, but the picture is painted with the same energy as the rest of this year's Gospel. Satan tests Jesus...but fails! The Father of Lies will return but he will be as impotent then as he is now and from the Cross in agony and suffering the Son of God will cry out: "It is finished". The great work of our Redemption will be completed.

This Lent is our opportunity to join with the Carmelite sisters, with all believers, to unite ourselves with the Crucified King as we offer our whole lives to Him. Let's not delay, let's not put it off for another year. Who knows where the world is heading? Join with the Mother of God, so greatly loved by Carmelites, in following her son, the Christ, who alone can bring pardon and peace.
