

DURING LENT What Is Ash Wednesday? On this first day of Lent, Christians



attend liturgical activities and receive ashes on our foreheads in the form of a cross, signalling a sign of our faith and a reminder of remorse for our sins. We are told "Repent and believe in the gospel," when we receive the ashes. With these ashes, we recall our origins from the earth, as well as how our bodies shall return one day to the same form (as indicated by the dictum "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return"). In true fashion of life coming full circle, the ashes are produced from the burning of palms of the preceding year's Palm Sunday, which comes the week before Easter Sunday and marks the welcome Jesus received from followers upon his return to Jerusalem prior to his crucifixion.

While many people traditionally eat plenty on Shrove Tuesday, Christians are called upon to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday. As outlined in the Catholic Church's Code of Canon Law: "Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. " Canon 1251
