#### An Appeal for Prayer

I am a member of LIFE and as such I am asking for prayers, not only for LIFE but for all those who are working and promoting respect and protection for life in all stages from conception to its natural end.

A pernicious culture of death is growing in our country. Let me illustrate this by highlighting three areas of grave concern.

A growing campaign to legalise abortion up to birth, with plans to decriminalise abortion whatever the circumstances.

The continued availability to obtain pills through the post which induce abortion at home. This nullifies the precautions put in place by the 1967 Abortion Act, and makes these measures unlawful, as well as taking away protections which were in place for vulnerable women.

Hand in had with all this is a concerted drive to introduce "Mercy Killing" or so called "Assisted Suicide" by the end of this year.
