"Oh, that today you would hear God's voice......" (Psalm)

Many people in 21C culture experience difficulty in praying. Prayers that we learned in school come to mind quiet easily. We have much to be grateful to our teachers for that. Yet childhood prayers seldom satisfy the adult heart. Life's experience exposes us to our vulnerability and our limitations.

Our informed scientific minds no longer allow us to attribute natural and human catastrophes to an angry God. Neither do we try to appease this 'god' through one sacrifice or another. We are so well acquainted with the laws of nature to the extent that we do not need 'god' to explain the floods (as Noah did) or the volcanoes of Iceland or the earthquakes of our mountainous regions. We did not need god to explain the tragic Boxing Day tsunami of Thailand. We acknowledge these as natural events of a physical world.

So why pray? Who is this to whom we pray?

"Prayer does not change God, but prayer changes the one who prays" (Kierkeghard). In the stillness of prayer, we can acknowledge our 'smallness' without any feelings of shame or inadaquacy, feelings we do not want others to see, feelings that our culture abhors. In prayer, we can 'sit with a friend', as Fr Gerry Hughes reminds us, a friend who knows us through and through, a friend who 'formed us in our mother's womb' and who promised that we would never be forgotten. In prayer, we can be true to ourselves.

In prayer, we come to the realisation that we are not so powerful that there is nothing we cannot do, which our culture would like us to believe. In prayer, we can come to the realisation of the relationship God wishes for us, of 'parent' to 'child'. Why else would Jesus have us address God with the title of 'Father', or s St Paul would encourage us to say, 'Abba', Daddy?

Carl Yung suggests that one root of our restlessness is our inability to sit alone for one hour without any props. An hour is a long time, is it not? We could achieve so much in that hour, we think, rather than 'waste' it just sitting. Yet, silence will slow us down, mind, body and spirit, and it is in that stillness that our very being can be transformed into the human 'being' it was created to be, affording 'gratuitous rest' from the human 'doer' most of us have become.

"Come away", Jesus invited his friends, "and rest awhile". That same invitation is ours too, even this week, even today, and every day!

Why not try this sometime during this first week of Lent?

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy no later than 28 February 2024. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Information about the Catholic Faith. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.

A big thank you to those of you who care for St Anne's in any way. Your time and efforts are very much appreciated.


A Brief History Of Music – Stretton Village Hall Friday 8 March 2024 Hurry - Just A Few Tickets Left!
