From the Headteacher's Desk...

Hello again to all readers from St Mary's school, After two terms, it is my time to handover the leadership of your wonderful school to Mrs Rachel Chadbourne. The whole reason for me accepting the interim appointment was always to ensure that the school was ready for this moment and to ensure that any visitors including Ofsted, would see it as a place that truly does inspire learning in the light of Christ.

Much has happened at the school. I am so pleased to see that the curriculum has been thoroughly reviewed to ensure that all get access to real learning that progresses and engages. I am heartened that the attitude to learning and school as a whole is so much more focused: it is a happy place to be in. I am though especially thrilled to see children and staff embracing the wider opportunities to grow and flourish in so much more but especially in sports and music.

St Mary's is very much on the map again with regard to sport: the football team is back competing: the netball teams are flying (we have absolutely dominated in recent matches and the last tournament) and the cross country engaged 80% of children across the school last week and were double winners in the last multi-school competition.

Quite a few of you will have heard many of the school musicians coming together as a band for assemblies and Masses. The Mass to end the Spring term with was very special. What is also lovely, is that many others do like to play little tunes in assemblies now too. Music to me is an essential building block of life: a beautiful expression of creativity. To see children musically inspired has made my time at St Mary's have additional worth. I am therefore thrilled that Mrs Chadbourne loves music too and that Mr Gillespie will be taking on the school band. He is also looking to create choirs as well in the months and hopefully years ahead.

Thank you for the support that so many of you gave to those being inducted for Confirmation and Holy Communion. Though the numbers are quite small, they are reflective of the numbers of Catholic children in but be in no doubt that the whole school is learning about these sacraments and recognise their importance as steps on their faith journey.

• First Holy Communion will take place on Sunday 9th June at 10am

• Confirmations will take place on Thursday 20th June at 7pm.

Faith is and will remain an essential part of the provision at your school as marked in the class masses, the wider prayer life of the school, the RE lessons and the day to day running of the school. I and all those attending, were for example very moved to witness the enactment of the 'Stations of the Cross' – simplicity and depth together. These have been a central part of our Lenten preparations alongside the learning of some Taize and a new (to them) version of the Kyrie Eleison.

A great school makes time for all of these key elements of education whether academic, pastoral, spiritual or creative. Indeed, without all of the elements, it surely can't be a great school?

We'd love you to continue to join with us in future masses here in school or when we come to church.

In the meantime, I ask for your continued prayers as Mrs Chadbourne takes the reins and builds further on the great things that have been achieved by the team including our governors with your support and that of Father Arul.

May your Easter bring many blessings to you all.
