#### Second Collection- Cathedral Maintenance



#### Fr Jules Chevalier 15 March 1824 – 21 October 1907

From a small and humble beginning in Richelieu in France during the turbulent post French Revolution years, Jules Chevalier was born the son of Jean Charles, an educated man with little faith, and Louise Oury, a lady who could neither read nor write but who possessed a deep faith in God. From this home, a man emerged who was to bring light and hope to a despairing post revolution culture. Leaving school early and apprenticed to a shoemaker at age 17, Jules' quest for religious education was blessed with support from his generous employer.

Jules emerged, as people do in any culture, to dream of a better world. For him, this dream crystallised as one in which love would be a 'force, strong enough to overcome any division that society might put in place between rich and poor, the powerful and oppressed, or the privileged and the marginalised' (Jules Chevalier).

He wrote that "Two wounds are corrupting our unfortunate world: indifference and selfishness. An effective remedy is needed that can be applied to these two evils. This remedy is found in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, who is simply love. People will be needed who will work to make him known. They will bear the name: **Missionaries of the Sacred Heart**" (Jules Chevalier MSC1856).

Prayer was always at the heart of Jules' ministry. While establishing the Society of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, together with his companion Fr Emile Maugenest, he sought assurance that they were, indeed, listening to God. While praying a novena, they received concrete signs, in the form of substantial endowments, that they were listening to God. This enabled the establishment of the first MSC house and chapel, the latter was to become the first chapel of the Society, later to become the current Basilica of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Issoudon.

Realising his dream was not, however, to be an easy ride. Quite soon, the social and political turbulence in France resulted in Jules and others vacating France. As has been proved true so often, in this was hidden a gift from God – the opportunity to take his vision further afield than even he might have dreamed: to the mission fields of Oceania in 1881 and later to much of Europe, America and Australia. Currently, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart have a presence in some 55 countries, with more than 1500 MSCs.

The 200 anniversary of Fr Jules' birth will be remembered worldwide in the many MSC communities on 15 March 2024. Awaiting some sign, Frs. Jules and Emile prayed day for nine days (novena) for the guidance of God's Spirit, praying earnestly to Mary, the Mother of God. They promised her a new title once their dream of establishing a missionary society was established. Thus, was founded the Society of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart in 1854 and some little time later, the title afforded Mary of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart.

You are invited to pray, as Frs. Jules and Emile prayed, for nine days, beginning on **Thursday 7 March until Friday 15 March**. I invite focus during this novena on peace in our turbulent world and for vocations to the society of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart and our sister missionaries, and I invite prayers through Mary each day. As Jules demonstrated, a dream without prayer is but an idea. Jules' dream was "May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be loved everywhere". Let us make this our dream too.

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. **Baptism:** Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

**First Holy Communion:** Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

**Confirmation**: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

**Information about the Catholic Faith**. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

**Sacrament of the Sick** (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
