Why I should be in church during Holy Week 2024

Whatever our age, we all live with a cocktail of human emotional experiences, some that lift us to the heights of joy filled exuberance, others that want to crush our spirits, others leaving us in a limbo of uncertainty, perhaps even fear. Our culture wants us constantly to 'move on', away from any experiences that would leave us feeling less than excited about life.

Yet our emotional responses to life's situations constitute a life enhancing reservoir, inviting us to a deepening understanding of ourselves and, as people of faith, understanding of our God, made human in Jesus Christ.

This Holy Week 2024 affords a further opportunity to understand and to appreciate just who Jesus Christ is for us - Jesus who was a complete human being like you and me. Let's not forget that Jesus was not a hologram, or a figment of any early author's imagination. When we listen to the bible this week with our heart more than with our head; when we allow what we hear to find an echo in those oft experienced moments of our lives, then something wonderful can happen. Our lived experiences are validated as God-given gifts to us, requiring of us a response, grounded in solitude, to give renewed life to us. Solitude understood as time alone, content with self.

Many will echo the experience and the response of King Charles and Princess Kate to their recent medical diagnosis. We are touched by its unexpectedness and its suddenness. Few, indeed, if any, will remain untouched by this. And, at the same time, we remain alive to the experiences of those in Moscow yesterday, as we do to the people of Ukraine, Russia, Gaza, Israel, and probably every country in the world, not forgetting the experience of those in our own varied families and local communities.

Each event will expose a raft of raw human experiences and will invite a truly human response, both personal and communal. During this final week of the life of Jesus, as we celebrate it during this Holy Week, we can surely identify with the joy of a party with friends, and how uplifting that would be. At other times, some may know the bitter taste of betrayal, the isolation of abandonment, that sense of being totally mis-understood and judged accordingly (witness the PO scandal), the sheer fear of intense physical pain, and seeing the cowardice of those who seemed so supportive and yet let us down. This is the lot of being human.

I suggest, then, that Holy Week is best understood and appreciated when we touch our own humanity, the constant ups and downs of our day-to-day experiences. With all that comes the challenge: to what extent can I imitate or echo the response of Jesus in my life? For us who know the fragility of our own humanity, there is the waiting, a waiting in certain faith for change, for resurrection, for new vision and new experiences. But it is a waiting, not to be hurried. And it is surely within this waiting that growth is achieved, experienced, celebrated.

Have you time this week to experience, and to wait, with others together in church?

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Information about the Catholic Faith. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
