Third Sunday of Lent



Confessions After Saturday 9.30AM Mass Fridays 6-7PM with Adoration



During Lent, we're called to reconsider how well we fulfil the basic Christian vocation that we all share, the call to holiness. In today's Gospel, Christ casts out the profane from the sacred Temple, yet He clearly associates His own Body with the Temple itself. In predicting His own death and Resurrection, Christ speaks for those of us who, through baptism, are incorporated into the Body of Christ, the Church. It is not just the Temple that should be kept holy, but those temples of the Holy Spirit that are the bodies of the baptised. If we are to be the temple 'made of living stones', God's commandments are the way of keeping that temple holy, and Lent is an excellent time to clean out the Temple of our own hearts and offer true Divine worship to God by observing His Commandments. We may consider three messages from the readings. God tells us that our relationship with Him must be that of a child to his parent, one of mutual love, respect, and a desire for the family's good, with no thought for personal loss or gain. The second reminds us that we are temples of the Holy Spirit because God's Spirit dwells in us. We are supposed to cleanse our hearts of pride, hatred, jealousy, and all evil thoughts, desires and plans. Thirdly, focus on our parish Church and how we use it. St. Marie's is where we gather together as a community to love and praise God. It is a holy place where we can find strength to help one another in our task of living the gospel. It is the place where we come privately to enter into intimate conversation with God. Many of you began your faith journeys here in this building, and many people have met the merciful Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and been welcomed back into our community. In this building, tears have been shed by those in pain, grief and also tears of joy. Let's look around our Church today and treasure it. When we pass our Church, we might take the time to make a brief visit. Let us make our Church even more of a holy place by helping to keep it clean, and by offering our time and talents in the various ministries

This week's Gospel – John 2:13-25 'Destroy this sanctuary and in three days I will raise it up'

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money-changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

Every weekday at 3pm, for this time, during the Hour of Jesus' Greatest Anguish, we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. We then put ourselves at the Foot of the Cross in silent prayer and intercession, consoling Jesus by our presence, praying for the conversion of sinners and the whole world, and for our own intentions.



In His revelations to St Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special prayer and meditation on His Passion each afternoon at the 3 o'clock hour, the hour that recalls His death on the cross. From these instructions, it's clear that Our Lord wants us to turn our attention to His Passion at this hour to whatever degree our duties allow, and he wants us to ask for His mercy. I know not all of you will be able to make it to church for this Chaplet, but we can all mentally pause for a "brief instant", think of His total abandonment at the hour of agony, and say a short prayer such as "Jesus, Mercy" or "Jesus, for the sake of Your Sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." For those that can please join us.

There is Eucharistic Adoration every Monday 9AM - 7PM & on Fridays 6PM - 7PM

Maybe, you've seen that we have Adoration every week or heard someone say that they are going to Adoration, but maybe you don't really understand what it means. That's ok! The practice of Adoration has been a part of the Catholic faith since the very beginning, and when we are "going to Adoration," we are typically referring to Eucharistic Adoration. Which, in the most basic terms, is the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass. The Eucharistic Hostis displayed in a monstrance on the Altar so that all can see and pray in the presence of Christ.

We can show our adoration to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. When attending Adoration, as a form of respect, you should always genuflect when you see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect, and if others are present, silence. Always keep in mind that you are in the presence of God!

Kneeling, sitting or standing, before the Blessed Sacrament are all appropriate forms of prayer. Let your posture reflect your worship and do what is comfortable for you. You really don't have to "do" anything during Adoration. You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him. If you are the only person in the church, don't be afraid to pray or sing aloud. This is your personal time with Christ.



"Whenever I go to the chapel, I put myself in the presence of our good Lord, and I say to him, 'Lord, I am here. Tell me what you would have me to do'... And then, I tell God everything that is in my heart. I tell him about my pains and my joys, and then I listen. If you listen, God will also speak to you, for with the good Lord, you have to both speak and listen. God always speaks to you when you approach him plainly and simply." – St. Catherine Labouré."
