Dear Parishioners

Last week we journeyed with the Lord up Mount Tabor for the Transfiguration. There His Divinity was revealed to his closest disciples Peter, James and John, to fortify them in the dark days coming up in the Passion. Christ will be rejected, scourged, beaten and humiliated as a common criminal executed in the most brutal Roman fashion, on a Cross. At that Transfiguration, the Old Covenant figures of Moses and Elijah...the Law and the Prophets...appeared alongside Jesus, they now relegated to minor roles in the unfolding of the New Covenant.

What then of the Temple, that glorious place of sacrifice, the epicentre of Jewish life, the Holy of Holies? Travelling with the thousands of pilgrims to Jerusalem for the great Feast of Passover, Jesus fulfils the requirements of the Law, eats the Passover Seder meal with his Apostles, and then on the next day, He ascends the throne of the Cross as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. The Temple veil is ripped in two. The debt is paid. Man is reconciled at last with His God, the created and the Creator at peace with each other after the disastrous fall from Grace in the garden of Eden. Christ, the second Adam, restores the eternal relationship through His self-offering at Calvary. Mary, the second Eve, gathers His body to herself as the Lord of Life descends to the very pit of our existence. The prophecy of the old man Simeon, when Mary brought the baby Jesus into the Temple, is fulfilled: A sword shall pierce your heart.

As we travel through Lent, let us try to fix our gaze on that Lamb of God, the Suffering Servant of the Prophet Isaiah. In some quiet moments, we can reflect on the great work done for our salvation, by the Lord Jesus, and let us thank our Father for this Sacrifice.
