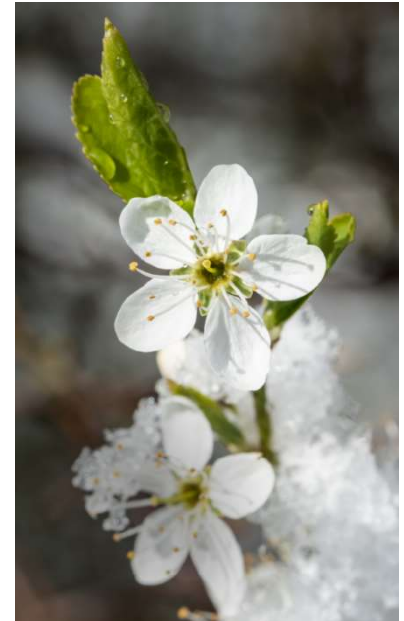
Please also let us continue our petitions for an end to war especially in Ukraine and Gaza.
