Fifth Sunday of Easter

I am the vine, and you are the branches, says Jesus today. We are strongly rooted in his love. Our resurrected Lord provides us with everything we need to draw closer to his Father and others. In the first reading, we learn that shortly after his conversion, St Paul was treated with fear and contempt by those he had been persecuting. Only Barnabas, who recognised his conversion and trusted him, took him to the Apostles. Shortly thereafter, it became clear that St Paul's fervour for the Lord and his Church stemmed from a very intimate encounter with Christ. Knowing that he was entirely loved, despite all he had done before, inspired him to preach the Good News. In today's second reading, St John supports St Paul's great accomplishment by saying: Our love must be more than words or mere talk, but something real and active. And today, we all know how active St Paul was and how great his work is. Today's gospel provides another magnificent vision of a very close contact with Jesus. Jesus is the vine, and we are His branches. Jesus does not say, "You are the branches, and I am the stem." While the branches rely on the stem for support, they are not part of the stem. The entire vine, includes the branches and stem, one organism. This illustrates that we are not just dependent on Jesus, but also parts of him. Through baptism we are put into Christ's Body, not just into an external relationship with him. We are one flesh, one body of Christ. Therefore, our parish is part of Christ's Church, a living organism and not an organization. The problem is that so many believers don't see nor understand this image and its significance. How about you? Can you see yourself as a part of Christ's life? Let us make a conscious effort this week to recognise that we are all branches of the same vine—Jesus—rooted in the love of God. Despite our imperfections and differences, we are eternally loved and accepted by a compassionate, loving, and forgiving God. Let us pray that we will have the grace to share this wonderful Good News, just like St. Paul did.

# This week's Gospel – John 15:1-8 'I am the vine, you are the branches'

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away- he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'

# **Responsorial Psalm**

You, Lord, are my praise in the great assembly.

The Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse is observed on 30 April 2024. It is always marked on the Tuesday of the Fifth Week of Easter in England and Wales. This year's focus is on communities who have been directly affected by allegations or convictions related to abuse especially, but not exclusively, within the Church. This may be associated with clergy, a teacher in a local school, a leader of a Catholic group or other person or group whose investigation or conviction is likely to affect the wider community. There will be legal and financial implications but, for the community, something that addresses their pastoral and spiritual needs can be very helpful. It can also support those who need to impart very painful information by helping them to draw on spiritual resources beyond themselves. This is not "spiritualising" the situation as if to diminishit; rather, it is to say that, for us, the bar is set higher as we know that all involved are children of God and part of the Body of Christ. What harms one harms all.
