### This week's Gospel - Luke 24:35-48

## 'It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead'

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread. They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

#### Feast of St. George shared table next Sunday

For the Feast of St. George's (23<sup>rd</sup> April) we will have a shared table in Hibbert's Hall for all the parishioners to attend, if you are able to bring food to share, please do so placing it in the Hall before next Sundays Mass, thank you.

Welcome to you all this third Sunday of Easter. The events of Easter exemplify the human condition, with the disciples experiencing feelings of betrayal, fear, anxiety, pain, loss, and doubt among others. However, it can be easily overlooked that God constantly summons and entrusts the weak and lowly people with important tasks. The slaves of the Egyptians were tasked to become the chosen people of Yahweh, not their masters. Moses, the poor public speaker, was to command Pharaoh to let the slaves go free. Christ was born in Bethlehem, not Rome, and an unknown maiden named Mary from Nazareth was to conceive and bear a Saviour. Jesus entrusted the great news of his resurrection to the women, not the pious Pharisees. We can easily undervalue ourselves in the face of what we can do; we can feel others would rather do a better job than ourselves or think that someone is better positioned than myself. The events of Easter remind us that when God chooses you for any work, he works through you to achieve his purpose beyond human imagination. The early Christians recognised the mission set before them, despite their own limitations. I pray that the same transformative power finds its way into the hearts of each one of you, so that we may focus on making the vineyard of the Lord a worthy place where the risen Lord truly dwells. Each and every one of us have been given diverse gifts and blessings, abilities and opportunities that are unique to the areas that God has entrusted to us to. As we see from scriptures, Jesus entrusted the great message of his resurrection to insignificant people, it is a sign that he can use us to do great things in the building up of his kingdom if only we let him use us. We are called to be courageous and committed to serving the Lord in all aspects of our lives, inspired by the Apostles and disciples; we should also be inspirational and dedicated in our actions, reaching out to others and proclaiming how God work's for us daily. This will help more people believe in our Lord and Saviour, come to seek him, and reconcile with Him through sacraments of baptism, confession, or reception into full communion with the Catholic Church. Our testimony of faith through our actions can change anything and anyone. With this in mind, please take a leaflet from the back of Church and give to a friend, a neighbour, a family member etc who may have stopped coming to Church or lost their way as this leaflet 'Why come back?' designed by one of our Parishioners may aid to guide them back.

I must sadly bring to your attention that we have had an attempt to gain entry into the Church on Monday night and again on Tuesday night, thankfully they did not gain entry, we are now in the process of looking to update both our CCTV and alarms. We have had a parishioner from Christ the King in Coventry look at the system on Friday morning, if you know of anyone who works in security and would like to quote please let Jimmie know.
