Today we mark the Octave Day of Easter. The gospel for the Octave Day is always the same. First it recounts the appearance of the risen Lord to ten of the apostles, and tells of the doubts harboured by St Thomas, who didn't see the risen Lord with his own eyes. It then recounts the event eight days later when the risen Lord came again to the upper room. This time Thomas was there with the others. From being the apostle who doubted, Thomas became the first apostle to confess the divinity of Christ. For having seen the risen Lord who shows him his wounds, he acknowledges him as his Lord and God. Jesus speaks to Thomas of those who believe without demanding proof. 'You believe because you can see me. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

This Octave Day has also been known as Quasimodo Sunday – from the opening antiphon of the Mass – Quasi modo geniti infantes (like newborn babes) that speaks of the newly baptised as the new children of God.

A more recent name is Divine Mercy Sunday instituted by Pope John Paul II in the year 2000 when he canonised St Faustina. Divine Mercy speaks of the mercy of God that floods the world through the Paschal Mystery of Christ's death and resurrection.

Thank you to all those who helped to prepare our churches for the celebration of Easter. Thanks also to those who helped prepare the service sheets for the liturgies, assisted with the Good Friday children's Stations of the Cross and the ecumenical procession, and to our servers and musicians who helped to bring such beauty to the sacred liturgies of these wonderful days. A thank you also from Fr Philip and Fr Sean for the Easter Offering to support them in their ministry here, and for the Easter gifts and cards they received.

Tomorrow (Monday) is the transferred Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord to the Blessed Virgin. This usually falls on the 25th March, but as this year this fell during Holy Week, it was moved to the first available day after the Easter Octave. Even though this feast has its focus on Gabriel's visit to Our Lady, the Angelus that commemorates this angelic visit, beautifully brings together the incarnation and the paschal mystery.

**Pour forth, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy grace into our hearts;
that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy Son,
was made known by the message of an angel,
may by His + Passion and Cross,
be brought to the glory of His resurrection,
through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.**



None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them, to present it to the apostles; it was then distributed to any members who might be in need.

Jesus Christ who came by water and blood,

not with water only,

but with water and blood;

with the Spirit as another witness –

since the Spirit is the truth.

Gospel**John 20:19-31**

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, ‘Peace be with you’, and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, ‘Peace be with you.

‘As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.’

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

‘Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.’

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, ‘We have seen the Lord’, he answered, ‘Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.’ Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. ‘Peace be with you’ he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, ‘Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.’ Thomas replied, ‘My Lord and my God!’ Jesus said to him:

‘You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.’

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
