"Happy Easter" – and then??

"Easter Triduum services drew enormous crowds in the UK. Westminster Cathedral, the largest Catholic Church in the UK (3000 seats), reportedly had to turn people away as the church could not hold the entire crowd that turned out for Good Friday" (Catholic Herald).

The days after the crucifixion and the 'rumoured' resurrection of Jesus must have been utterly confusing for the young adults whom Jesus befriended during the previous three years. Just what were they to believe? Could they even believe their own eyes? Dead on Friday; alive and well on Sunday!

Thomas was absent when Jesus first came on the scene after Easter Sunday. We can well understand him. "Alive, you say? I want proof", he said. And he had to wait another week before he got that. "Thomas got a bum rap. He was no more doubting than the rest of the disciples and the only reason he doubted and the others didn't was because they had seen the resurrected Christ and he hadn't yet" (anon).

As do so many people in 2024 (especially young adults) who do not readily follow 'traditional beliefs or ways of religious practice; young people who are, by nature, of a questioning mind. They need to know before they chose, which seems sensible, don't you think? Yet, there is a problem in that sometimes, even often, we, supposedly 'practicing Christians/Catholics', fail to provide them with that 'proof' which is neither about logic nor reasoning. It is surely about authenticity, genuineness – our lifestyles matching whatever 'teaching' we profess. And that is our tough call, yes?!

Folk of all ages are, in one way or another, searching; young adults especially. They are, perhaps unknowingly, followers of St Augustine: "our hearts were made for you, O God, and they will never rest until they rest in you". And it is 'proof' of this that they seek, namely, that our hearts (hearts of adult 'seasoned' Christians) indeed need God for our serenity, for our direction and for our compass in life, and that only with God can we say we are truly content.

Could this be what so many folk searched for last Good Friday in London and elsewhere, authenticity in a world culture that presents as so contrived and false? It is proof of this that Thomas looked for. He was surely not being awkward, rather authentic; an early agnostic, if you like, whom many of our young adults could well emulate.

So, what about you, now post Easter Sunday? Have you checked your compass recently?

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Information about the Catholic Faith. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
