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### We welcome Canon Paul Fitzpatrick to St Anne's Parish during his visitation of the parish

"We need well-formed lay people, animated by a sincere and clear faith, whose life has been touched by the personal and merciful love of Christ Jesus," "We need lay people who take risks, who get their hands dirty, who are not afraid of making mistakes, who go forward. We need lay people with a vision of the future, not confined to the little things of life." (Pope Francis June 2016 Rome)

"On 11 April, Fr Teddy, Loretta and I attended the inaugural meeting of clergy and lay members of the Banbury and Warwick Deanery. This meeting was called to start a new way of working within the Deanery and will be called the **BANBURY & WARWICK DEANERY PASTORAL COUNCIL.** 

As this was the first meeting, the ninety minutes or so was spent outlining the purpose of such a council and it's aims and objectives. Essentially the main purpose is for clergy and lay members of the parishes (particularly lay) to help and inform the Dean in his decision-making, and debating issues that will affect the running of parishes in the Deanery. It has the benefits of bringing clergy and lay members together and breaking the barriers that sometimes exist between the two (not at St Anne's of course!). We will share ideas and best practice and help each other to develop ways of running parishes, and in turn, the Deanery.

This is the first time this has ever happened. There are nominated representatives from each parish that will sit on the council, with the usual officer roles coming from this membership, eg Chair, V Chair etc. It is also hoped that there will be representatives from other Catholic stakeholders, such as schools.

At this meeting, no decisions were taken but importantly, we outlined some of the boundaries that would inform our working process, eg debating theological issues does not form part of the council's brief. There are other forums for conversations about issues such as women priests, divorced and remarried etc. Interestingly there was a lot of discussion on how well, or otherwise, our own parishes were run. It was surprising that some parishes did not have any committees or governance processes in place, so we talked about how we could help each other set these up. I offered the opportunity for other parishes to visit our council meetings so see "how we did things" ....no one took up the offer!

It will be a good idea for us to amend our own Parish Council agenda to reflect the above and, perhaps, to have a standing item about what we want to send upwards to the Deanery Council.

I suspect it will take some time for the Deanery Council to work and for us to see any meaningful results, but it is worth giving it a go. If it becomes a talking shop and decisions are overruled by, let's say, the archbishop or his council, then it will quickly become questionable. I also think we need to be radical in our views and discussions, but the make-up of those present – mainly middle age white males – doesn't suggest that we will get the diverse views we need."

#### Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at <a href="mailto:fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk">fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk</a> or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

**Baptism:** Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

**First Holy Communion:** Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

**Confirmation**: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

**Information about the Catholic Faith**. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

**Sacrament of the Sick** (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
