Second Collection Today – Emergency CAFOD appeal for Sudan

Having spent the weekend with Canon Paul (who was here representing Archbishop Bernard) I am gradually getting used to the restructuring of parishes and deaneries within the Archdiocese of Birmingham. The age profile of clergy is becoming ever more obvious as a 'problem in waiting' and one crying out for some 'solution'. I have seldom been bothered much with this aspect of church life, preferring somewhat greater freedom to innovate as and when! Yet, needs must, it seems.

A visit last week from Carole, an old friend, (not her real name). prompted me to think again. She called apparently for no reason other than to say hello and to catch up. I suspected there was more. "There must be more", she said. "There just has to be more". Her 'first' in chemistry at Oxford leading to a well-paid career, together with her enjoyable life with her husband, John, and their two children, was leading her to question her direction in life. Materially she wanted for little. Life, she had thought, could not get any better. And yet.....

Whether it was covid or the ease with which she could have anything she wanted, it was beginning to stir within her a certain feeling – a 'longing' or an 'emptiness' she called it. A Catholic education all here young life had fostered within her a deep moral sense that she treasured. Sunday Mass, while frequent, yet not as 'regular' as she would like it to be, and did little for her. So many seemed, she said, just to 'go' to Mass and then just go home. "There must be more", she kept repeating.

I told her that she was not alone and that many, especially adults in their early adult years (and into their prime of life – and later), were similarly 'searching'. What life was offering was beginning to be experienced as an illusion, even a 'lie'. What was being offered seemed like was 'counterfeit currency' and did not 'buy' the contentment they, at this time in their lives, looked.

We chatted for over an hour during which I assured her that, even in the third part of life, this search continues. And we surmised, without being too dogmatic, that what was missing (the 'more') was a relationship with Jesus Christ, as a 'waypoint, to that relationship with God, the Father, that we had heard so much about in school and in church. A relationship with Jesus that was intimate, vulnerable, honest, authentic.

I have no doubt that we will, with time, get used to the re-structuring of deaneries, parishes, even diocese. Too few priests of appropriate age, to many churches costing too much to manage them, too few parishioners to enable churches to remain open every day. Re-structuring alone will not achieve the promised outcome of vibrant communities of people caring deeply for each other. Carole's 'more' is called for.

The 'more' that Heather looks for is already present within Catholic communities in many parishes. It is present here in St Anne's parish and Cannon Paul was not slow in praising you for this. Yet, it cries out for re-awaking in us all. All else we aim for is but a 'way point' to that personal knowledge and relationship with Jesus Christ which is primary.

You are asked and encouraged to familiarise yourself with whatever 'changes' may arise in the months ahead, and to embrace these as efforts to re-vitalise our personal and communal inherited faith.

Are you up for it, with Carole, to experience the 'more'?

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Information about the Catholic Faith. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
