This week's Gospel – Luke 24:35-48 'The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep'

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. 'I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. 'The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

Welcome to everyone on this Good Shepherd Sunday, which is typically a day of special prayer for priestly and religious vocations. While it is true that everyone has a call to vocation and holiness in life, the Church also needs people with a generous spirit to devote themselves to serving God's people as Church leaders. Pope Francis' image of priests 'with the smell of sheep' shows serving as a Priest in a parish is always a source of joy and fulfilment. In today's Gospel, Jesus describes Himself as the "good shepherd" who sacrifices His life for the sheep. He, the perfect shepherd, calls all to follow Him. The good shepherd knows his sheep by name; they are wellknown and cared for. This teaches us the value of individual attention and acknowledgment. Every person you meet has a name, a story, and a worth that deserves recognition. Whether you are in a position of leadership or a member of a community, remember the value of seeing and appreciating everyone. Jesus also speaks of other sheep that are outside of this fold, whom he must bring along. This highlights the inclusive nature of His mission. As followers of the good shepherd, we are called to embrace diversity and extend our care beyond our familiar boundaries. By accepting the role of the Good Shepherd, we are invited to lead with courage, love unconditionally, and always seek the lost and the least. May our lives, like that of Jesus, our Good Shepherd, leave a legacy of care, sacrifice, and inclusive love. Today, we pray for those whom Christ has called to be Priests, those who participate in this 'shepherding' in the ordained ministry. The Easter season reminds us that the Good Shepherd, who gave His life for the sheep, now calls us to the new life of the Resurrection. We also welcome Fr Michael McCarthy IC, a fellow Rosminian from St. Peter's RC Church in Cardiff, who has returned to the Parish after 20 years, whilst Fr Aji is away. Keeping this message of community let us all gather in Hibberts Hall after Sunday Morning Mass for the shared table to celebrate the feat of St. George. As you look around the congregation today, how many names do you know? How much recognition do we give one another? There are lots of new families and members in the parish so let us take this opportunity on Good Shepherd Sunday to get to know each other, say hello and celebrate the forthcoming Feast of St. George.
