Banbury & Warwick Deanery: First meeting of the Deanery Pastoral Council met on 8th May. Over 40 lay representatives and parish priests met for the first meeting in Bicester. The minutes will appear on the Deanery website. Meanwhile, the main agenda item was around the grouping of the parishes into 5 possible clusters, known as Leamington, Rugby, Bicester & Banbury, Stratford and Kenilworth. It was agreed that representatives of the parishes on the Deanery PC should meet with the parish priests before the next meeting on 19th September to discuss the proposed clusters, recommend any improvements and share how parishes within the cluster can support each other in fulfilling the Diocesan Vision.
