A further offer of more 'Gratuitous Love and Rest' (from God)

For many parents of young and not so young children, this week will offer some time for rest, relaxation, and even fun, while for others, examinations beckon, with all the tension and anxiety that they might present.

For others, too, unexpected bereavement and illness remain part of their daily lives with the difficulty that illness always surprises us because the outcome is never certain. And then, with the onset of fine weather, sometimes too warm, long evenings can test the endurance of those unable to get out and about due to infirmity or old age.

We can all so easily doubt ourselves, our worth, our usefulness, and we can even wonder about our God – "how can such love", we may ask, "permit some pain and suffering in a world created by this God?"

Here is a reflection from friend who struggles often with pain and confusion and who loves her grandchildren so much. She shared it with me and now I offer it to you (with minor adaptations) and with her permission. Try imagining God looking upon you right now. Just what might God say to you on this great Feast of Love, the Feast of the Most Blessed Trinity? Perhaps take a little *ME TIME* this week to wonder....

"I see the depth of love you have for your family, for your little ones. I know the hopes and dreams you have for them in their vulnerability. I see your sadness when you know that they might never know the depth of love that you have for them.

I experience the same sadness when I think of you and know that you never experience the depth of my love for you, that you never see me laughing with your little children and grandchildren as you play with them and splash about in the muddy puddles, pretending to be Peppa Pig.

It is indeed a wonderful moment for me to see you enjoying the present moment.

But my heart breaks for you when you won't share your pain with me, when you try to go it alone, when you lock your pain up in your heart. I, too, have hopes and dreams for you. I dream that one day you will surrender yourself into my arms and feel my love for you. I hope that one day you will not be enslaved by your past, that you can be free from the burdens you carry.

I dream that one day you will know my love for you, that you will trust enough to accept that love, because it comes without strings, without conditions. My hope is that, together, we can rejoice in the present moment whatever it might be and walk hand in hand into the future" (God)

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at <u>fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk</u> or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2024 should contact Fr Teddy. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Information about the Catholic Faith. Those wishing to explore the Catholic Faith and who may wish to become members of the Catholic Community should contact Fr Teddy.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
