" Now this is the Catholic Faith. We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in Unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance..."

How many could identify where/when this is said? Or even where it is from? It sounds a little like the Creed we recite every Solemnity( that includes Sundays), which is called the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed after the early church councils where it was formulated.

This other Creed( there are 3..the shortest is called the Apostles' Creed which is said at the beginning of a rosary)...this Creed is the Athanasian Creed, and it used to be recited regularly but in the church reforms over the centuries it gradually dwindled in prominence and now is said only once a year, on today's feast of the Holy Trinity...if at all!

Confused? That is what most are when faced with the central Christian doctrine of the Holy and Undivided Trinity. The Catechism is very clear on its importance:

" The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian Faith and Life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of Faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of Faith."

The Trinity is a mystery and perhaps we should heed the wise words of an early Greek Father of the Church:

" Let things beyond words be honoured in silence."

A big thank you to the party organisers for last week after the Sunday parish Mass at Holy Trinity to welcome Declan and Claire into the Catholic family. Our next " event" will be First Communions on 9th June at Holy Trinity and that brings all the Instruction of children, teenagers and adults to a close…before we begin the next cycle! If you have or know of young people coming up to the next sacramental age, or any adults who are enquiring about reception in either parish…please ask them to make contact so we can start to plan for 2024/5. Very exciting!
