THE TWO PARISHES' BUILDINGS St Peter's: the Finance Committee agreed to ask the diocese for help in assessing the redevelopment of the hall to provide a less costly parish resource and some money-making flats. Preliminary discussions are beginning. The presbytery will also be looked at later. The latest fire regulations inspection revealed that there are potentially some expensive works needed affecting both hall and the flat, if we are to use both as we currently do. You will be kept posted. *Our Lady's* We have to carry out a fire regulations check to hall and church, which, since fire regulations have been tightened recently, will almost certainly mean expense on the buildings. We are awaiting detailed quotes for the roof work which, with the heating, looks like it will be about £100,000. You will be kept posted.
