Sunday 9 June 2024 – 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time Readings: Year B

Dear Parishioners

This last week we commemorated on 6th June the 80th anniversary of Operation OverLord, the D-Day landings on the coast of Normandy that marked "the beginning of the end" for the Third Reich and the Second World War. More than 150,000 troops assaulted the five beaches of Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword in the largest amphibious operation ever launched in history. 6,000 ships and landing-craft, 50,000 vehicles and 11,000 planes supported the push to establish beachheads on French soil. It was a success, by 11th June the beachheads were secure and over 326,000 allied troops and 100,000 tons of equipment had crossed. The human cost was high. Over 8,000 Americans, 3,000 British, 1,000 Canadians and up to 9,000 Germans were killed, wounded or captured. On the day itself over 4,000 allied troops died...sons, brothers, fathers...unbearable sadness and suffering was the reward for a job well done, a task that had to be accomplished to rid the world of the Nazi evil. But at such a cost for those families.

The following day, on Friday, we celebrated the great Catholic feast of Sacred Heart...Cor Jesu Sanctissima...and a more fitting response to the horrors of warfare could not be found. This powerful devotion, the second most popular after the Holy Rosary, reminds us that the heart of God is a boundless source of Love and Forgiveness...despite the wickedness of the world and the darkness of mankind's own heart. The Sacred Heart beats in the Body of Christ, His Church, and despite all the efforts of tyrants and dictators, this Heart can never be stopped. History shows us that the foolishness of the world is always overcome and the darkness scattered in the face of God's blinding Love. Nazis, Communists, Islamists...all try and fail to quench the Flame of Love. The Sacred Heart united with the Immaculate Heart of Mary will triumph!

This weekend we are seeing our children make their First Communions and we must continue to pray for them in their walk with Jesus. No more precious gift will they receive than the Life of Jesus in this most blessed of Sacraments.
