Sunday 23 June 2024 – Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time Readings: Year B

Dear Parishioners

Today's Gospel is one of the most striking of all episodes in the life of Jesus and His disciples: the Stilling of the Storm. Jesus sets out with his friends in a boat to cross the Sea of Galilee. This is a notoriously unpredictable stretch of water, an inland lake measuring 12 miles by 7 miles, relatively shallow at 200 feet in the deepest, but prone to sudden and violent storms. These are the result of cold winds sweeping down through the wadis and the steep hills surrounding the water and hitting the relatively warm surface. A calm evening can descend quickly into a cauldron-storm. Things look bad as a major "weather-event" erupts and waves start to sink the boat. Jesus is still asleep in the stern, exhausted from His healing and preaching work. "Master, do you not care?" He wakes, silences the wind and the sea, and the disciples are struck with awe asking among themselves..."Who then is this? Even the wind and waves obey Him." In their hearts, the disciples know who this is. To the Jews, only one force could control the unruly elements of Nature, only one Person was able to bring order to the chaos of existence: Yahweh, The Lord God Almighty. They had just seen Him for themselves. The sea, the archetypal uncontrolled force of the universe, could only be tamed and brought to heel by the Divine. "Who then is this?" That is a question for us all.

In the storms of our lives only one Person is able to bring calm and order: Jesus Christ, Son of the Father, Saviour of mankind. In the good times we let Him sleep but as we begin to go down we look to Him. He could ask us as He asked the disciples: "Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?" Instead He says: "This is my Body. This is my Blood" Freely given, freely offered. In every Mass we see and we adore. As we sing at the end of Benediction: "O Sacrament most holy O Sacrament Divine, All praise and all thanksgiving, For evermore be Thine."
