Second Collection today - Day for Life

Fathers' Day 2024



Each Father's Day, I think of my own father. I called him "dadda". Being the youngest of ten children, I probably was a 'little' special (though I would never admit that!). I like occasionally to think back to those early childhood days. 'Dadda' just seemed always to be around and, while we lived what would now be called 'below the poverty line', we were never really poor.

I cried as I said the ritual prayers over his grave: "we commit his body to the earth....". And occasionally I wish he were here now. Like many father/son relationship, there is much unfinished business between father and child which I sense Fathers' Day reminds us to address! Surely worth while, don't you think?

Yet all my memories are framed with the great love he showed to all the family: his empathy when we were naughty, his generosity when, with so little to spare, we shared what there was to share, his presence at the end of each day as we shared our meal and prayed together. So many of you will echo these scenes, will you not? Are these not "good old days" that could benefit us now?

Dadda taught me to pray by praying with me. He taught me respect by respecting me. He taught me forgiveness by teaching me the word 'sorry'. He taught always by showing how or 'allowing' mistakes as the great teacher (as Jesus did). He had 'the look' (did/does your father have it?), that could achieve what it was intended to achieve without a single word spoken!

On Fathers' Day, memories can be so healing, can they not? Many men among you will know the joy in your heart at the birth of your child, a joy that surpasses any words used to describe it. And as your child grows up, to hear that word "Dad" for the first time, expands your heart beyond imagining. Which is surely good reason to honour our fathers today and never to forget what we have received from them. And, as a father/grandfather, a good day to thank God for your fatherhood too, yes?

Jesus had little respect for titles. Yet when He was asked to teach the disciples how to pray, He said: "When you pray", He said, "say 'Our father..." As you, a father, looks on your child now, of whatever age your child might be, so does God, as Father, look upon you. We know, from statistics, the effects on children when a father, biological, step or adoptive, is absent from the home. Can you, today, invite God (Father) to enter your home, to see you as God's child, and can you not see God loving you as you love you own child? This could change your life, you know!

Happy Father's Day to all fathers, and to the fathers of fathers

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2025 should contact Fr Teddy now. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.


Events At Princethorpe College during June and September 2024
