Sunday Mass and Summer Gathering and the General Election

They're surely not connected, you might say. So, consider:

What is *Sunday Mass* if not the gathering of a people who, through shared values and a common faith, come together to experience their common humanity in its neediness of sustenance in mind, body and spirit, to give thanks for what they have received, and to await some experience of their 'God'.

Attending to the Word of God in scripture and, hopefully, applying this to day-to-day events, affords focus where so much in our culture 'demands' our attention. Sharing Eucharist empowers us with God's Spirit in our day to day lives that follow. In bringing us closer to each other physically, it offers a broader perspective on our own lives that can so easily become quite self-focussed and enables us to hear other's stories that so often echo our own.

Attending Sunday Mass is always a choice and how we understand and value our Mass will inform our choice to attend or not. Habit should not be the driving force.

A Summer Gathering invites contact with a community wider than that of our shared faith. The presence of people of all faiths and none emphasises our shared common humanity in a non-threatening environment and affords an atmosphere where shared camaraderie exposes the value and need of physically meeting 'others'. Our Summer Gathering invites us to 'waste time' with each other with no intention other than 'to be with' another, perhaps to delay when the urge to leave intrudes. We encounter neighbours that we never otherwise meet. Again, we can hear their stories than can but broaden our experience of life.

How we value our presence to each other and theirs to us will inform our choice to attend or not.

A General Election invites choice but with very limited physical contact or knowledge of those whom our choice may affect. We have generic knowledge of issues and candidates and some specific knowledge of some people who may be affected. Yet ours is but one vote of a potential 46+milliom people registered to vote in a General Election (2021). Our choice will be impacted by history of past governments and by endless unassured promises, all of which, of course, are 'fully funded and fully costed'! "It's none of anyone's business who I vote for" often prevents us sharing our political opinions with each other, out of fear of being judged. This surely limits our political vision. Politics is one of those topics, is it not, together with religion and sex, that are so often barred from the dinner table. And yet, each affects us in more ways than we might like to pretend.

How we choose to be informed this week will surely impact on the one precious vote that is ours to cast. 'How we have always voted' should not be the driver.

Question: to what extent do, do you think, each of these three events contain a similar Moral Imperative? Is our 'duty' to attend Sunday Mass on Sunday 30 June on a par with our 'duty' to cast our vote on Thursday 4 July and our 'duty' to be present at our Summer Gathering on 6 July?

Catholic Life And Sacraments At St Anne's

As in all parishes, sacramental life is important for families at whatever age children and adults may be. Here are some basic guidelines about arranging any of the sacraments. Contact should be made to the parish office at <u>fr.teddy.obrien@rcaob.org.uk</u> or with stanne@rcaob.org.uk

Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism for their child(ren) should contact Fr. Teddy at least three months in advance of their desired date. Thay should have some suggested dates in mind for the ceremony. Contact as above.

First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2025 should contact Fr Teddy now. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Marriage: Couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in St Anne's Parish must contact Fr Teddy directly at least twelve months prior to their desired date or email the parish secretary at stanne.wappenbury@rcaob.org.uk. Chapel dates, for either church, will not be reserved until this has happened. In addition, couples should not make any final plans for anything related to their wedding until they have confirmed the church date in writing.

Sacrament of the Sick (formerly known as The Last Rites). Those who wish to receive this sacrament, or to receive Holy Communion at home, or if you are in hospital or about to go into hospital for any procedure, please contact Fr Teddy. You do not need to be seriously ill to request this sacrament.
