Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

Corpus Christi Procession

As many of you are aware the Feast of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christis traditionally celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, 60 days after Easter. It was very early in the 14th Century that the custom developed of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a procession through the town on Corpus Christi Day. It was in 2006 that the Holy See gave recognitio to transfer to Sundays the Solemnities of the Epiphany of the Lord, the Ascension of the Lord and the Body and Blood of Christ, hence why this Sunday is celebrated as the Solemnity. I am not sure when the last Corpus Christi Procession took place in the town centre of Rugby on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday true to tradition, one of you may be able to recall? However, when I arrived to Rugby I had this desire in my heart to do this with you, and there are many to thank for helping me revive this tradition here in our town. We were supported along the way by Rugby First, Rugby Borough Council, Cllrs Ish and Senthil so we give thanks to them. To the many volunteers on the night, the first aiders, the stewards, especially to those who were in the Clock Towers from 5PM arranging the Altar and cleaning Market Square. Receiving Holy Communion

We have recently noticed at Mass that a very small number of people have been receiving Communion by Intinction (receiving the Sacred Host in one's hand and then taking it and dipping it into the Precious Blood). This practice is discouraged as it obscures the distinct fulfilment of the invitation of the Lord to 'take and eat', to 'take and drink'. It also presents a serious risk to those who live with Coeliac disease, since it inadvertently introduces gluten into the chalice of the Precious Blood. Following the Bishops' lead we would ask you not to practice Intinction when receiving Holy Communion at Mass and to consume the Body of Christ in the front of the Altar and not upon returning to your seat. Thank you.

Welcome if you are visiting our parish and not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion by crossing your arms across your chest.

This week's Gospel – Matthew 14:12-16, 22-26 'This is my body; this is my blood'

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.

Sacrament of First Holy Communion & Confirmation School Children First Holy Communion Sat 8th June 11AM Parish Children First Holy Communion Sat 15th June 9:30AM Confirmation Wednesday 19th June 7PM

This Sunday is the magnificent feast of Corpus Christi, God's greatest gift, the Body and Soul, Blood, and Divinity of Christ made present for us in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar, which began officially around the 13th century. Nothing on earth is remotely worthy of reverence, let alone adoration, as what we see and taste as bread but what our faith reveals as the Body of Christ Himself. Holy Scripture, the Church's entire tradition, and the saints all bear witness to this. Jesus declares, "This is My Body," but do we always remember to approach the Blessed Sacrament as a physical experience with the divine? Not only that but this encounter is made possible by the loving sacrificial offering of Jesus Himself? Although it is clearly connected to the Last Supper, Mass is more than that because Christ's Body was broken and given on Calvary as part of His sacrifice. The Crucifixion, which is made present to us at every Mass, is symbolised by the Last Supper. The Mass sacrifice represents Christ's sacrifice, and the Blessed Sacrament is the fruit of that sacrifice, Jesus broken and given. So, just as the centurion witnessed Christ's divinity at the crucifixion, so must we witness Christ's divinity as revealed in the Blessed Sacrament. It is a time to meditate on the great mystery of how bread and wine actually become Jesus Christ's Body and Blood. Although they still resemble bread and wine, the Father transforms them into the Body and Blood of Christ through the Holy Spirit. Because of this, when we receive Holy Communion, we believe that we too are transformed. When receiving Holy Communion, we say one Hebrew word: "Amen!" When the priest holds the Body of Christ in front of us and says, "The Body of Christ," we all answer with a "Amen." This word means "so be it," or "I believe." When we receive communion, or when we wait in the line to receive Jesus, really meditate on this word "Amen" and know that when we say it, we are saying, "I believe this is truly Jesus Christ, transformed from bread and wine and he is going to transform me into him". This is the most precious gift that God the Father has ever bestowed upon us. Let us approach this sacrament with a spirit of reverence and with the word "Amen" on our lips and in our hearts. The Catholic faith in its altars, church buildings and tabernacle bears witness to the true depth of God's love. Let us, His people, remember to bear witness to it as well.

June is the month of the Sacred Heart

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus falls on Friday 7th June. Great benefits are promised to those who practice this devotion. Also, during this month, we can seek to deepen our devotion to the love of God revealed in the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus - a devotion encouraged by St Margaret Mary, whose relic rests in the altar at Blessed Robert Grissold Church in Coventry. If you would like Fr Aji to visit and bless your home during the month of June then please let us know via the parish office.
