Receiving Holy Communion

We have recently noticed at Mass that a very small number of people have been receiving Communion by Intinction (receiving the Sacred Host in one's hand and then taking it and dipping it into the Precious Blood). This practice is discouraged as it obscures the distinct fulfilment of the invitation of the Lord to 'take and eat', to 'take and drink'. It also presents a serious risk to those who live with Coeliac disease, since it in advertently introduces gluten into the chalice of the Precious Blood. Following the Bishops' lead we would ask you not to practice Intinction when receiving Holy Communion at Mass and to consume the Body of Christ in the front of the Altar and not upon returning to your seat. Thank you.

Welcome if you are visiting our parish and not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion by crossing your arms across your chest.

New prayer book launched for young people during this Year of Prayer

A new prayer book aimed at young people, their priests, chaplains and teachers has been published to commemorate this Year of Prayer. Former work colleagues Fr Michael Beattie SJ and Fr Simon Ellis, parish priest at St Margaret Mary in Perry Common, Birmingham, have been collaborating on prayer materials for over a decade. It was deemed fitting to publish this latest, adapted resource - Watch and Pray - during the Year of Prayer and soit is now available. "In this new resource we mix traditional with contemporary prayers," said Fr Simon. "There are a number of simple morning and evening prayers which could be used privately or in collective worship in schools and colleges and the chaplaincies. There is a large section of devotional prayers centred around the Archdiocesan Catholic Schools' Pupil Profile which highlights gospel values and gives scriptural material to bring them alive. "The Foreword is written by Archbishop Bernard Longley." The new book costs £8, plus P&P, with all profits going to the St Margaret Mary Church Centenary fund. The Centenary will be celebrated in 2026. The book includes an Introduction with Fr Simon; Prayers of Adoration; Novena Prayer for the Canonisation of Blessed Dominic Barberi; Prayer to St Chad, Patron of the Archdiocese of Birmingham; reflections and much more. Accompanying illustrations are the work of a Ukrainian artist, whose family lived with Fr Simon and his family after they moved from Ukraine. Fr Simon can be contacted at

This week's Gospel – Mark 3:20-35 'A kingdom divided against itself cannot stand'

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind. The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saving. 'Beelzebul is in him' and. 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house. 'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.' His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

2nd Collection Next Week

Next week this will be for the Day for Life. The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. A debate on end-of-life issues has been in the headlines in recent months with calls for assisted suicide being expressed, especially by celebrities, a view that opposes the Catholic view that life is a gift and that we are called to care for others at the end of their lives. If you would like more information on the Day for Life then please do take a booklet from the back of Church which will give you a little more information and thank you for giving what you can in the 2nd collection next weekend.

In today's readings, Genesis recounts the repercussions of Adam and Eve's first sin, succumbing to the temptation of the serpent, the Devil himself. The Bible tells the story of how God's love undoes the effects of their first sin. In the pages of the Gospel, we see Jesus conquering the Devil through healings of all kinds, raising of the dead, and the casting out of devils from the possessed. All of this shows how the initial sin taking the fruit against God's plain command—and all subsequent sins are removed by the fruit of the Cross, Jesus' own sacrifice. When it appeared that the Devil had prevailed, God was preparing for his ultimate defeat. Today, in our own lives, it can be a great feeling to feel aggrieved, and to be able to blame someone else for why things went wrong. We can be all prone to it, and our blame culture certainly encourages it. And sometimes our grievance is justified - we have been wronged, sometimes seriously. But, sometimes, it may be more 50-50, and sometimes it was our fault. Aggressively blaming the other person rarely succeeds in doing anything but dividing. Adam immediately blames Eve; Eve immediately blames the serpent. They're both right, but it would also have been right to tell God, 'I got it wrong, sorry' - right, and more constructive. In todays Gospel, we see the scribes can't see any good in Jesus. That's a terrible place to be! Consider this; if we can accept responsibility for our failings, above blaming others; if we can find the good in others, even when there's wrong too, we're much more likely to unite rather than divide. This will help to bring peace into divided households, especially as we look to consecrate our family homes to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
