SUNDAY 2 JUNE 2024 Sunday Readings: Year B

This Sunday is Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Originally on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, it was moved to the Sunday by the Bishops of England and Wales in 2006. It still remains on the Thursday for many countries, for example Spain where it is also a public holiday in some provinces.

St Thomas Aquinas suggested this feast to Pope Urban IV and he wrote the beautiful hymns Salutaris Hostia and Tantum Ergo which we sing at Benediction. In the Middle Ages the Mystery plays were performed at this time in England but with the abolishment of the feast by the Protestant powers in 1548, they too lapsed. In Rome Pope Francis will lead a Corpus Christi procession from St John Lateran to St Mary Maggiore and in Oxford the Oratorians will be doing the same, as a Catholic presence in the city.

So what is it all about? The " bells and the smells", the Monstrance raised in blessing, the veneration of the Sacred Host...

It is our response to the simple words of Jesus:

" I am the Living Bread..Whoever eats this Bread will live for ever. This Bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

These words are clear, plain and convincing. At the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist, the self-giving of His Body and Blood. On Corpus Christi we celebrate that gift. As the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity are lifted up before our eyes, let us adore Him who came to save and cleanse us from our sins, Jesus Christ our Lord and God.

Masses as usual next week.

Next Sunday(9th June) it is First Communions for our primary school children. Please support them in your prayers.
