Dear Parishioners

This last week Fr Tony and I have been on a three-day residential course called " The Synod for priests" in Leamington. It was a gathering of the diocesan clergy, to discuss and prepare for the future as parishes face reorganisation in the face of the diminishing number of Weekday in Ordinary Time serving priests. The Archbishop was also with us, with his " Curia"(HQ) and we spent the time in prayer, worship, group conversations and fellowship. It was very good to hear the wisdom of the senior men like Fr Tony, and to be challenged by the energy and enthusiasm Weekday in Ordinary Time of the vounger priests who are an impressive lot, if thin on the ground at present. Much will be asked of them and we must keep them in our prayers at all times.

This Sunday's Gospel could not be more appropriate for such an event. Jesus tries to explain Weekday in Ordinary Time about the Kingdom of God. What is it like? Where is it to be found? No doubt the crowds were expecting a warrior-like Messiah to usher in the reign of God with force and power, like the hated Roman occupiers and all the kingdoms of this world. Jesus picks what must have seemed like a strange way of describing the new age that He embodied...seeds, in particular the tiny mustard seed. How insignificant they are, how weak and vulnerable to Weekday in Ordinary Time destruction! Yet, it is these apparently insignificant things that become something much greater, working away without human help or intervention. The smallest of them the mustard seed grows to be a substantial tree, totally unexpected from its original state. Each parish, each priest, each person is a seed of the Kingdom and if we allow the Holy Spirit to feed and nurture us, we will produce that harvest, that tree so useful for others called the Church.Through the celebration of the sacraments, the preaching of the Gospel, good works, charity and fellowship we can face into the future with confidence and trust in the God whose kingdom we pray for at every Mass.
