THE ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY was first established by a group of Parisian students in 1833 as a way of helping the poor in that city in practical ways. They were inspired by the life and example of St Vincent de Paul who worked to alleviate the poverty, both spiritual and material, he found around him. This movement spread to Britain in 1844 with the same aim of providing practical support and friendship for anyone in need. Although it is a Catholics group, those they help are from any background or belief, or lack thereof. Since it was established, the SVP has helped countless thousands of people, whether individuals or families, who are in particular need, and the SVP now number about 10,000 members. There are also groups of 'Minnie- Vinnies' who are the junior members of the society where younger parishioners create opportunities for living out the Gospel command to 'love your neighbour'.

Next Sunday we, at St Joseph's and St John's, will have a visit from a representative of the SVP with the aim of launching a group here in Banbury. They will speak at the Vigil Mass on Saturday, and all the Sunday morning Masses. Unfortunately, they aren't able to stay for the evening Mass at St Joseph's on Sunday, but if you are interested and this is your regular Mass, could you come to one of the other Masses next Sunday?

Whilst the town and its surrounding areas are, in many ways, quite prosperous, there are also those in great need, both financially and emotionally.

One of the elements of the Diocesan Vision that each parish is asked to focus on is Social Outreach — of looking outward. An effective SVP group has the potential to be a very positive way that the Catholic community can make a difference to community around us.

THE NEW LECTIONARY - This is the book that contains the readings we use Sunday by Sunday and day by day at Holy Mass, and is the book that readers or lectors and deacon read from. Towards the end of this year the translation we use for the scripture readings and psalms will change. The scripture readings will be from the English Standard Version, and the psalms from the Abbey Psalter. For us this is quite a useful moment as the lectionaries that have been using for many years are falling apart!

We will need to purchase the four lectionaries for both our churches – Sundays, weekdays, feasts and occasions such as weddings, funerals, confirmations etc. Each volume is £175. The Book of the Gospels used for Sunday Masses and at Requiem Masses is £295. They are beautifully produced by the Catholic Truth Society, and are well fitted to the dignity required of their place in the celebration of Mass. If anyone would like to donate towards this, you are most welcome.

Please remember in your prayers **Canon Richard Walker**, who was Parish Priest at St John's from 2014-2020, as he prepares for his ordination to the episcopate as an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese, along with Mgr. Timothy Menezes, at St Chad's Cathedral on 16th July. St Chad's isn't a large church, and so space is limited. BANBURY & WARWICK DEANERY - The first meeting of the Deanery Pastoral Council (DPC) meeting was held last month. It was agreed that the representatives of the parishes on the Deanery PC should meet with the parish priests before the next meeting on 19th September, to discuss the proposed clusters, recommend any improvements and share how parishes within the cluster can support each other in fulfilling the Diocesan Vision.
