Welcome to Mass, and a special welcome to those who are visiting.

Following the 8.45am Mass at St John's and the 10am Mass at St Joseph's there are refreshments available. Please feel welcome to come along.

Today we welcome to Banbury a representative from the SVP who will speak about the work of the SVP, in the hope that we can set up a branch here in Banbury. The St Vincent de Paul Society was first founded in France, and soon spread to Britain in 1844. It is now found in many countries of the world, and is a way that Catholics in their own parishes and areas can bring practical help and companionship to those in special need in the community around them. One of the elements of the Diocesan Vision is that each parish is to have, as one of its aims, social outreach – of looking outward so that the Church here can live up to Our Lord's injunction to be salt of the earth and light to the world – and to aspire to fulfil the commandment to love your neighbour. Following up on today's talk there will be a meeting for all those interested on Tuesday 23rd July at 7.30pm in the Dupuis Centre when you can find out a bit more about the SVP and what it can offer.

And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came. which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.

Gospel

Mark 6:7-13

Jesus made a tour round the villages, teaching. Then he summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.
