Sunday 21 July 2024 – Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Readings: Year B

Dear Parishioners

"The Lord is my Shepherd...". This beautiful song of King David is a funeral favourite, but despite having sung it many times over the years I still find it a moving and uplifting cry of praise and thankfulness to God, the Shepherd of His people. There is a deep comfort in the sentiment that we have Someone who cares so much that He will never abandon us. As the Psalm continues (in the King James translation, most frequently used):

"Yea, though I walk through the Valley of the shadow of death I shall fear no evil. For Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff They comfort me."

Leadership, in this context Kingship, is portrayed as a Shepherd's role, a man who will tend, protect and guide those in his charge. It is an ideal, and reading the pages of the Old Testament it is clear that most fell badly short, even King David himself in his dark periods. The prophet Jeremiah in our first reading condemns the bad shepherds who fail to do their jobs but are only concerned for themselves and their interests. Disaster will fall on the people he warns and disaster certainly did in the shape of the foreign armies who swept down, overpowered and destroyed Jerusalem, leading its citizens into captivity and exile.

Yet despite this constant disappointment, the promise is given of a leader who will rise and rule...a shoot of King David...a Messiah, who will at last fulfil the Shepherd's role.

Jesus said: "I am the Good Shepherd" and we can see the depth of His compassion for those who were following Him in the Greek word used to describe His feelings when they were "like sheep without a shepherd." He was "moved in his innermost being" or an older translation "yearned in his bowels"! This is the mark of the true Shepherd, one whose life revolves around the safety and welfare of the flock.

Let us pray for Shepherds of this stature, in Church and State, those who can rise above personal agendas and egos and inspire others to follow. We need men and women of such calibre in unstable and dangerous times.
