## **Dear Parishioners**

In our Gospel today Jesus returns to His home town of Nazareth a bit of a "nowheresville" in Galilee, a backwater of the Roman Empire. As the apostle Nathanael exclaimed: "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Probably a village of approximately 4-500 souls, they were excited to receive back a local boy who was doing so many astonishing things: "They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him?" Jesus' reception seems initially warm and positive...but not for long as their original comments turn to sarcasm and negativity: "This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary..."

St Mark does not mention what Jesus had been saying but clearly it had annoyed the locals and got under their skin. Now they were casting aspersions on Him, his humble work and inconsequential family background. "And they would not accept Him."

Why would they, who knew Him so well, not accept Him? Because they saw the Humanity but could not or would not see the Divinity. Why not? Because they were spiritually complacent and assumed that as the descendants of Abraham they had a free ride into the Kingdom of God...and Jesus was very clear that this was not the case, as He explained through parables like the Sower. "He was amazed at their lack of Faith."

Where are we in this episode? Like the locals who see but do not see, or hear but do not hear? Or are we like so many of those healed and restored by the Lord who know that He is the Saviour? He is the same Lord and God today if we accept Him into our lives and ask Him to draw us ever closer. In this turbulent life, only with Him is true peace.
