#### ***The Smile Train Changing the World One Smile at a Time***

For many years, people from this parish, both schools and the local neighbourhood, have despatched thousands of parcels to children in deprived communities in Eastern Europe, bringing joy to the lives of many children. Many of you are involved in gathering together the items for these parcels and in preparing the parcels themselves. You have become a sort of community for Teams4U in itself. And it is to the credit of generous donors that the thousands of pounds needed to despatch these parcels was raised.

However, there are very many children worldwide who never want to be seen and who wish only to hide because of a facial disorder called Cleft Palate. While this is easily remedied, many cannot afford the modest cost for such an operation(s) The image below shows the transformation that can liberate a child, enabling him/her to live a normal life as a child and into adulthood.

**Cleft** lip and palate (CLP) cause significant disability, economic hardship, and psychosocial stress worldwide, and low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) register the majority of CLP cases. LMICs lack the human resources, infrastructure, health policies, funding, and information needed to meet local CLP treatment needs, forcing rural patients to travel long distances to receive specialist care, at great financial costs. From an annual birth rate of 24.5 million in the Indian sub-continent of 1.1 billion, for example, the birth prevalence of clefts is somewhere between 27,000 and 33,000 clefts per year.



These unmet needs are often catered for only by charities. **Smile Train** is one such charity that caters internationally for this need. In 2023, it transformed the lives of 105,00 children internationally and launched partnerships with 57 medical centres across 26 countries.

Our Summer Gathering this evening will raise modest funds and enable some child(ren) to be freed from the imprisonment of Cleft Palate and restore joy and hope to the child's parents. What a privilege to be part of this.

While continuing to support Teams4U, I am inviting our involvement in childrens' lives, from here on, to be broadened to embrace children who cannot face the world and for whom a simple operation can be transformative. My own nephew was born with severe CLP and now, in his 50s, he lectures worldwide on the impact of wave theory on international communications, thanks to the experimental treatment he received as a baby/child many years ago.

**“Better to light a penny candle than to curse the darkness”**, don't you think?

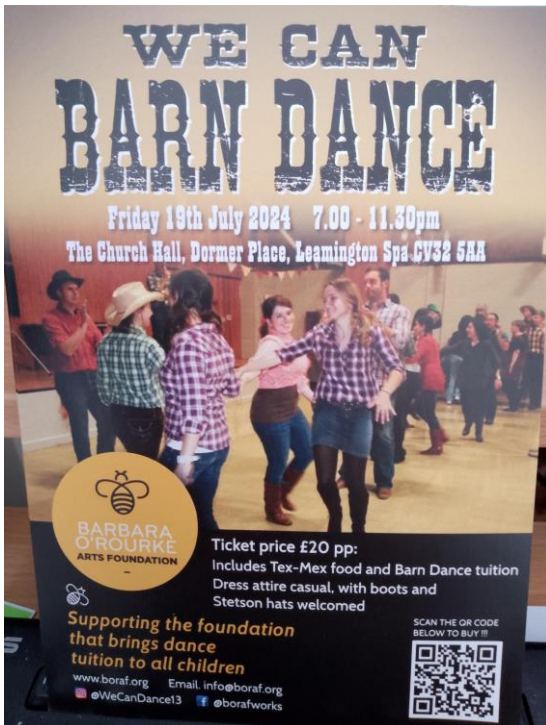
