## "My heart will not rest until it rests in God" (St Augustine)

My car computer has, for a number of weeks, reminded me that my car needs a service. The 'spanner' symbol' stubbornly emphasises this need. I have chosen to ignore this because the car runs well, as normal, no further red lights appearing, and anyway, I will check the need for a service 'when I get round to it' on my return. In the meantime, I hope my car will continue to serve me without any problems.

People of the Moslem faith are required to pray seven times each day. Similarly, Catholic clergy are mandated to pray seven times each day plus their Rosary, their meditaton and their time allocated to 'spiritual reading'. I must confess there is much I need to address in these matters. So much to do, so many demands on my time, so many people to see, and those social media 'demands'......All excuses, of course. Because the same twenty four hour day that I now have, enabled Hannibal to take his elephants over the Alps – and much more, so to speak.

Which is another side to *'vacation time'*. Taking time out just 'to be' is all very well but it can so easily lead to naval gazing – how wonderful I am, or just how awful I am, and anywhere in between.

In this vacation *'time out'*, we can choose to 'service' the person I have become: enticing mind, body and spirit to a genuine 'service', more a major service than just a change of oil and filters! Focussing beyond this immediate world view to wondering about my place in the hugeness of God's created world.

Nourishing our minds with a selection of serious reading: mine this year will be revisitng '*The End of Memory*" in which the author explores the perrenial possibility (or otherwise) of ever being able to fogive and let go of serious hurts before death.

In prayer, trying to find, again, some meaning in the daily round of psalms is my challenge, psalms that retain their baffling characteristic while at other times, seriously uplifting. And reading these psalms ever more slowly which can take some serious discipline.

And phsysically, slowing down in the day to day movements: taking more time to nourish my body, so often neglected in the rush to do (or to be seen to do) so much! More time to do the 'ordinary', dining (instead of just 'feeding'), cleansing (instead of just 'washing). Noticing the 'other' instead of just saying 'hi' or hello', and patiently waiting for a reply when you genuinly inquire 'how are you'?' while embracing the other in their own world.

My car may malfunction if I do not, very soon, give it the computerr-requested attention. And I, too, may 'malfunctiomn' if I do not afford myself the attention signaled by tiredness, irritability, inattentiveness to some essentials in my life, and perhaps missing the beauty of the summer season and its long, dreamy days and evenings.

How about it, then? Book yourself in for a full service this summer?!
