

#### THE WORD THIS WEEK

In the first reading from the Prophet Jeremiah, God condemns leaders who mislead His flock and promises to personally restore and protect them with just & wise leaders, ensuring their safety and growth. The Psalm assures us that we're guided by the Lord and need nothing more. He comforts and protects us always, and we will dwell with Him forever. St Paul reminds us in Ephesians that Christ has made us one by His sacrifice, breaking down barriers and granting us all access to the Father, ensuring peace among us. Finally, in the Gospel Jesus and the apostles retreat for rest, but a large crowd follows. Seeing their need, Jesus compassionately teaches them, recognizing their need, like sheep without a shepherd.

#### 'Loneliness' at heart of Pope's theme for 4th Grandparents Day.



Next Sunday, Catholics around the world will be invited to reflect on the great heritage and wisdom passed on by their grandparents and the elderly. The Pope has chosen the theme: "Do not cast me off in my old age" (Psalm 71:9). It's meant "to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throwaway culture." In his message, Pope Francis will draw on the verse from Psalm 71 that depicts the plea of an elderly person who reflects on the story of their friendship with God.
