Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In recent years, the word 'mission' has been often used in the Church to remind the faithful of the universal call to holiness. The readings this weekend call us to reflect on the nature and challenges of mission. In the first reading Ezekiel is sent to the people of Israel who were in Babylon, to reassure them on God's mercy and love. However the prophet was warned that as God's prophet, he would endure rejection and persecution for spreading God's message. Similarly, the Gospel reveals that many people of Jesus' hometown of Nazareth did not accept Jesus as a prophet because they "knew" Jesus and his family too well. They knew Jesus as a carpenter with no schooling in Mosaic Law and knew that this

"son of the carpenter" could not be the promised Messiah who would come from Bethlehem as a descendant of David's royal family. It wasn't just Jesus' mission; their prejudices made it difficult for them to engage with Jesus. We are called to be missionaries to present Jesus. This mission in our present world sees challenges. Pope Francis reminds us that "every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love." Once we have encountered Jesus Christ and His merciful love, we are called to share that encounter with others. We are called to this mission regardless of who we are. St. Paul tells us in the second reading about some of his problems. He does not go into great detail, only to say that he couldn't take it any longer, "I prayed urgently to the Lord, asking Him to help me, to take this thing away." The answer was always the same: my grace is enough for you for my power is perfected in weakness. Whatever Paul's difficulties were, God did not remove them, he was given the strength to bear it. We do not always get what we ask for, but God

will always give us what we need.

This week's Gospel – Mark 6:1-6 'A prophet is only despised in his own country'

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.
