Welcome to you all. In this week's Gospel, our Lord Jesus invites His disciples to take a break as He sees their weariness. At the same time, He is moved with compassion for

the crowd, describing them as "sheep without a shepherd." Thus, we have two elements together: spiritual rest and God's compassionate action involving us in His affairs. This perspective offers us profound insights into our own lives. Often, we run ourselves ragged with daily responsibilities, forgetting to take time to simply be with God. Jesus reminds us, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while." As it is not easy to find rest even within ourselves, we must

organise a sacred space, like a turtle withdrawing into its shell or a hedgehog curling up. This space is about a moment where we stop everything and just be in God's presence, allowing His peace to fill our hearts and renew our spirits. Can you imagine the scene when you are in the process of finding rest and see that Jesus is moved with compassion because "they were like sheep without a shepherd"? They look and feel like "wobbly tired-out sheep," stumbling through their days, unsure of where they are headed. Their weariness draws Jesus to them and disrupts our right to rest in God's presence. In this conflict of interest, we learn that our true rest is in Christ. Once we fix our eyes on Him, everything makes sense, and we become in tune with Him. We begin to see that we are often like those who disturb our time. While we strive to find rest in a sacred, interior space, sharing everything with Jesus, we also recognise that as Jesus looks at the crowd with compassion, He shows us that God's presence is our guide, even when we feel something has been taken from us unjustly. Thus, in our spiritual journey with God, we need quiet, restful moments. At its core, this journey must be

centred on God and the compassionate guidance of Jesus, who offers what is best.

Parish Census

Parish Meeting

Thank you to those who made the meeting last Tuesday and to those sending their apologies in advance. To give a brief synopsis of the meeting the following points were discussed;

Rugby Deanery Clusters

As you will be aware the Birmingham Archdiocese have formed small clusters, we form the Rugby Cluster along with Sacred Heart in Bilton, English Martyrs in Hillmorton, St Annes in Wappenbury and Our Lady & St Wulstan in Southam. It is very early days for the Clusters and the parishes will continue to work together as we have been doing, but will now work more closely, be it in joining catechism classes together etc. In our Cluster we have two priests of retirement age who will continue to serve their parishes and we along with Fr Arul will support when we can. As part of the cluster each parish will have two lay representatives from each parish to discuss strengths and weaknesses of each parish as we seek to support each other.

Parish Feast Day – 8th September

We are seeking support from volunteers to help organise the Feast Day and for your ideas, so please do get in touch. Fr Aji was asked if there could be a retreat day in the parish prior to the Parish Feast Day and we will progress this further.

Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary - 7th October

For the Feast we will have a Day of Devotion and welcome the visitation of the Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima. The Pilgrim Virgin Statue will process into Church on Sunday evening and we will have a day of devotion on the Monday. We will require volunteers and include the parish school in this Day of Devotion

Catechism

The Catechists were thanked for their devotion and hard work in preparing the RCIA, Confirmation, First Holy Communion and Sunday's Children Liturgy. Forms will now be out well in advance for the next RCIA, Confirmation and First Holy Communion classes, please do take a form. Childrens Liturgy will pause now over the Summer Holidays and return in September.

Church Grotto

A proposal was put forward for a Grotto outside the Church so those who wish to sit and pray whilst the Church is closed can do so, an area for this is to be looked at and further planning is required.

Fr Tom Thomas IC

The Dicastery for Evangelisation has appointed Father Tom Thomas as Apostolic Administrator of the Prefecture of the Falkland Islands. Fr Tom is currently serving as Rector and Parish Priest of St Etheldreda's in central London and will take over as Apostolic Administrator of the Prefecture whilst continuing his work in the parish. In addition to his appointment as Apostolic Administrator of the Falkland Islands, Fr Tom will also serve as Ecclesiastical Superior of the Missions for the South Atlantic islands of Ascension, St Helena and Tristan da Cunha for a period of five years. Fr Tom hopes to visit and work with the faithful and priests in the Falkland Islands in the near future, as well as continuing to work at St Etheldreda's church in London. Fr Tom succeeds Abbot Hugh Allan, O.Praem who has completed his five-year term.

RCIA

Thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church? The Catholic RCIA stages are a good model of basic faith development. A number of people have expressed an interest in pursuing the Catholic faith. Everybody is welcome or maybe you would like to refresh your faith.

What is the RCIA?

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith for persons who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and seeking either Christian baptism in the Catholic Church or full Communion with the Catholic tradition of Eucharist and Confirmation. It is a jounery which enables the study of the Gospels, Catholic Christian teaching, the acceptance of Christian values and morality, the development and deepening of a life of prayer and action with the support and involvement of the local Christian community. The RCIA is more than a course of instruction. It is a process of conversion, designed to meet the unique and individual

needs of the participants.

Who is RCIA for?


• Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith

• Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith

• Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Eucharist.

• Practicing Catholics who wish to renew their faith.

When we say we are "going to Adoration," we are typically referring to Eucharistic Adoration. Which, in the most basic terms, is the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass. The Eucharistic Host is displayed in a monstrance on the altar so that all can see and pray in the presence of Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that, "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628) We can show our adoration to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. When you come you may wish to kneel, sit, stand, or even lay on the floor before the Blessed Sacrament which are all appropriate forms of prayer. You really don't have to "do" anything during Adoration. You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him. If you are the only person in the church, don't be afraid to pray or sing aloud. This is your personal time with Christ.

"Whenever I go to the chapel, I put myself in the presence of our good Lord, and I say to him, 'Lord, I am here. Tell me what you would have me to do'... And then, I tell God everything that is in my heart. I tell him about my pains and my joys, and then I listen. If you listen, God will also speak to you, for with the good Lord, you have to both speak and listen. God always speaks to you when you approach him plainly and simply." – St. Catherine Labouré


This week's Gospel – Mark 6:30-34 'They were like sheep without a shepherd'
