At the beginning of August I spent a relaxing couple of weeks with friends in Le Conquet on the Brittany coast. We had great conversations, lots of time to read and occasional venturing out to explore some of the beautiful places of the area. Sadly the Gothic Church in our town was closed, the roof having been ravaged by Storm Ciaran in November 2023. We did visit many lighthouses and their displays at night did not impact the incredibly clear skies we mostly had. No sign of the Perseids amazingly.

On one of our trips out, my friend suggested we go to the Church and town of St Jean du Doigt. Housed in this beautiful Church is a Treasury Room with lots of gold and silver on display; including a reliquary containing a finger of St John the Baptist. This relic arrived there in the early Fifteenth Century attracting pilgrims, visitors and those seeking healing.

You will know that last Thursday we remembered the Passion of St John the Baptist. Allow me to share with you some of the photographs I took in this delightful Church: The Reliquary: A detailed Icon and an imposing statue of St James (I'm guessing because of the shell, the symbol of pilgrims).

In other news in this last week, the remains of Saint Teresa of Avila in Alba de Tormes, Salamanca, are found to continue to be uncorrupted.
