## **Dear Parishioners**

We are now in the final instalment of our five-week sojourn in St John's Gospel. The first chapter saw the miraculous feeding of the 5,000. Then Jesus tries to move the conversation to an understanding of the eternal over the here and now, the need for soul food rather than just to fill the stomach! The crowd, gathered to eat and drink, are confused and as the weeks pass and Jesus reveals that He is the Bread from heaven, the mood music shifts. This week the murmuring of the past becomes outright rejection of Jesus. " Many" turn away leaving only The Twelve, one of whom we know will betray Jesus. 5,000 down to 12. Not a good plan, not a promising beginning. When Jesus asks the Twelve if they are still with Him, Simon Peter as usual responds for everyone: "To whom shall we go?" St Peter, our first Pope, puts it simply..."You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that You are the Holy One of God."

Jesus in these last five weeks has shown the people who He really is, not just the man from Nazareth but the Holy One, in whom we are called to believe. For all of us, young and old, lay and ordained: do we believe, enough to hear and follow the Holy One? Or are we, like the crowds, only interested in what we can profit for our own appetites? Jesus calls every one of us to follow Him as disciples.

Are you listening? If you hear Him, are you following?
