Message from Fr Damian: Regarding the Silver Jubilee Celebration, I was overwhelmed by the well wishes and attendance at the Mass on The Feast of the Assumption and for the Celebration Mass and Lunch last Sunday, It felt unreal. I never thought I could be celebrated in this way. The support and effort from everyone involved was incredible. Thank you all.

Readings 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our Readings this weekend focus on faith, commitment, and unity. They show us the importance of choosing to follow God and living according to His teachings. In the first reading, Joshua challenges the Israelites to choose whom they will serve. This decision is crucial for their identity and future. Joshua reminds them of God's faithfulness and the many ways He has delivered them. The second reading from Ephesians speaks about the love and respect in marriage. Husbands and wives are called to reflect the love between Christ and the Church. This unity is a model for all relationships. In our Gospel Jesus addresses the difficulty of His teachings and acknowledges disbelief among His followers. After many leave, Peter reaffirms their faith, recognizing Jesus as the Holy One of God and chooses to stay. Following Jesus is not always easy. It requires accepting difficult truths and making sacrifices even when the path is hard.

"Pope Francis is asking us to think about how we care for the whole of Creation as an expression of our own Christian Faith and is referring us to St Paul's letter to the Romans, which speaks about the whole of Creation groaning, but also looking for the freedom which Christ brings us as children of God... "Hope and Act with Creation is the theme for this year, and I hope you'll be able to pray that we and others will value all that we have in creation as a way of praising god and also caring for those who are most in need."
