SEPTEMBER: MONTH OF OUR LADY'S SEVEN SORROWS

'And a sword shall pierce your own heart... Luke 2,35
O sorrowful Mother, pray for those in sorrow today.

The wicked jealously inflicting suffering on the good is a theme of the first reading. Can they break the good man? Will God come to vindicate him?

Then in the Gospel Jesus reveals Himself as that good man who will indeed be made to suffer out of jealously, to see if indeed God will help Him.

Christ's Passion bears all the hall marks description given in the book of Wisdom. And against this, the disciples argue about which of them is greatest! Jesus has none of this and speaks of servanthood and humility. He takes a little child as an example—powerless yet trusting, loving yet vulnerable—as an example of welcoming Christ and His Father too in the welcome we give to the weak, vulnerable and needy.

PARISH FINANCES: The Parish Finance Committee met this week. The Parishes' finance are not strong. Of particular concern is the continuing high cost of running St Peter's Hall. The committee unanimously agreed that options for reducing spending on the hall need to be explored. It is the fixed costs of running such a very large complex that challenge us: gas, electricity, maintenance, repairs, inspections, complying with fire and health & safety legislation, sanitary services, internet, coupled with very low demand from outside hirers and bills to make the flat lettable and the hall roof sound. In the last eleven months the hall raised £8,118 and cost £27,789 to run. A loss of £19,671. The management group meets this week to discuss the actions needed now. In the longer run, this shows how our review of buildings and their use is so necessary. We are still awaiting professional proposals.

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are *not* a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are *warmly invited to come forward for a blessing* at the time of Holy Communion.
